

I read "The blue-eyed boy" story in 2006. Before that time, I thought of making a film with a monochrome point of view, but not black and white. Fortunately, I read the book and it compelled me even more to make a film with a blue monochrome point of view., then I decided to adapt it into a script.



I wrote many drafts and tried to really elevate the script for this blue monochrome point of view. I wanted to expand this from a simple children's story into something deeper that would appeal to an adult audience as well.

I tried to give depth to all the characters without forgetting that the story is about a boy with blue monochrome eyes. After many rewrites I asked Saeed Ghorbanian, a thoughtful and genius writer/poet to collaborate with me. His help with the dialogue was invaluable and he even wrote a poem for a sequence in the middle of the film.

Shooting in a village with a cast that include old women and a small boy was challenging. I was very lucky to have had the opportunity to make this film. During the process many amazing things happened, a great DOP came on board along with great actors and actresses. And I was able to obtain the rights, I am so grateful. I am very happy with the way the film turned out, and am even happier to share it with the world.

"The blue-eyed boy" is the most famous work of well-loved writer Javad Mojabi, and this film is the first film/TV adaptation of 'The blue-eyed boy'since 1973. Masoud Soheili felt such a strong inclination to make the film, that he would have done so without the rights, even if it meant not being able to show it. However, fortunately, he was able to get the rights from Javad Mojabi, himself after searching a lot to find him. Finally Mojabi, granted Soheili the rights.

The short film project was an exciting opportunity to bring this very special short story to the screen.




Javad Mojabi Orginal story

Also, as a photographer he won numerous awards and was showcased in many photography exhibitions.




Carlos Manzano

Mehrnoosh (born in 1976) is a musician and pop singer from Tehran, Iran. She currently lives in the USA and is signed to the record label Avang Records, a California-based Iranian company. Her song شمات ("Cheshmat" meaning "your eyes"), broke a record on Persian Internet radio station, RadioJavan.com. Its video on YouTube had more than 2 million hits in about two years. Another song named "Naro" (Don't leave) also received playtime on Persian Radio.



She said in an interview with RadioJavan.com that most of her songs except videos, were done in Iran despite the many hardships she had to face as a woman.

Prior to her musical work, she taught mathematics at the university level in Iran.



Gloria <u>Singer</u>

The child of an Iranian Singer and French songwriter, Gloria is literally born into music. By age 4 she already records her first song "Ticket Magique" at the Polygram Studio of Bordeaux. A few years later she moves to Bern and grows up with Persian, French, German, Italian and English classics and 80's-90's swiss pop songs.



She first finds her passion for music playing the Accordion, Harmonica, Organ and Flute, although the seeds of electronic music are sown early as she favours her Roland synthesiser above all other instruments, reminding her Jean-Michel Jarre "Oxygène"'s album.

By age 15 Gloria moves back to Paris and starts writing songs by now guitar in hand, inspired by her favorite rock bands (K's Choice, Skunk Anansie, Metallica, Cranberries). However she still feels the need to diversify beyond music, and discovers the energy of french Electro djs and producers (like Daft Punk and Bob Sinclar).

Raised with strong values to feed the mind and soul she attends medical school, before turning to sound engineering in Paris. After two years at the EICAR she heads to London to immerse herself in an eclectic atmosphere where everybody seems to be into music. She lends her vocals to indie rock bands "the Transmitters" and "Crossroads". Occasionally she also deejays minimal house in underground venues under Lady Granite's name.



A great experience Gloria feels she wants to pursue, and after a brief time in California, where she gets to sing in duo with Persian singer "Sattar" at Cabaret Teheran, her curiosity for a new culture leads her to Milan. From collaboration with young movie directors and performances at Hanger Biccoca, to live sets at private venues she gets to knowledge the contemporary side of the Italian city of fashion.

Gloria works on a partnership project called "Positive Social Interaction" boasting live experimental ambient shows featuring homemade sounds and vocals. Later on, guitar in hand she is asked to interpret Iranians songs for lebanese band "Zeid and the Wings" first part, in front of an important crowd.

Back in Teheran Gloria becomes student of Hamed Zand's setarist and Hale Seyfizade Traditional Persian vocal teacher; an important step in which she develops new skills and tastes.



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HISTORY

Iranian Youth Cinema Society Executive Producer

After the Islamic revolution of Iran and in the 1985, with the aid of cinema vice-presidency of ministry of culture and Islamic guidance, The Iranian Youth Cinema Society resumed its work with the aim to encourage the Iranian adolescent to the film-producing and photography. meanwhile with the gradual opening of other 50 branches and offices all over the country society made an effort to attract all those who are interested in learn directing, script writing, photography, cinematography, film editing as well as holding the annual courses in film-making



Until 2006, IYCS had more than 96 thousand graduates whom were trained and produced training programs and short films in 8mm, VHS and S.VHS formats. Some of them gravitated to professional production. Furthermore IYCS held 4 regional festivals in the various spots all across the country between 1989-1997

Holding twenty seven round of n Tehran national and international short film festivals, beside three rounds of documentary film festivals about cultural heritage memorial, two round of concepts of the Quran and Iran culture film festival (Until the end of 2004), Iran land of culture and culture-industry film festival (Until the end of 2004) and the land of olive film festival (2009) are among the noticeable achievements of IYCS

In the international scene though, IYCS products had been screened and young film-makers of IYCS have received numerous praiseworthy prizes in the well-known festivals, as to mention: France Clermont-Ferrand, Cannes, Marseilles, Cinema Du Reel, AKS, Annecy, Provence, Finland Tampere, Netherland IDFA, Germany Oberhausen, Duisburg, Hamburg and Stuttgart, Italy Venice, Montecatini, Turin, Milan and

Archipelago, Russia Saint Petersburg, Spain Barcelona, Bilbao, Valencia, Austria Ibnese, Hungary Mediawave, Czech Republic Karlovy Vary, Serbia and Montenegro Belgrade, Denmark Odense, Poland Krakow, South Korea Busan, Japan Yamagata, Greece Drama and etc

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IYCS became a member of UNICA, union international the cinema as a representative of Iran in 1990 and had a constant presence in its festivals. Moreover IYCS as a representative of Iran is a member of international federation of photographic art (FIAP) and paved the way for the artists and photographer to introduce their works by founding the international Iran photo agency (IIPA).


In the production area, Up to 1997, IYCS films were limited to presenting the students products in, 8mm – VHS and SVHS formats, however after this year by regarding to extensive participation of IYCS"s experienced and elite film-makers in creating quality products, The professional producing of short films department were established by producing the 16mm beta cam, 35mm, DVCAM and beta as well, and up until 2005, more than 940 professional short films were produced which brought in 80 prizes in international scene for the Iranian Youth Cinema Society.


Signing joint film producing contracts with organizations, entities, interior and exterior institutions, holding a regular photo and film weekly programs in IYCS offices across the country, prospect of documentary cinema"s of, France, Netherland, Lebanon and Palestine, setting up individual and collective photo exhibitions for young photographers in various cities, the plan to hold programs on future cinema from 1998 to 2000 at Palestine cinema and Sepideh cinema just once a week which gradually extended to 18 province, emphasizing on the necessity of screening the short films in the cinemas, distributing IYCS best products in country video network, Iran broadcasting (IRIB) and other international stations, holding annual exhibition of world press photo in Tehran and also design and initiating 4 exclusive websites are the additional activities of IYCS up until 2005

At the present, The Iranian Youth Cinema Society has the preparedness to present all its products concerning all films and photos to be shared with enthusiastic applicants. However with the geographical expansion of IYCS 60 branches in all over the country, IYCS is ready to cooperate with all parties and organizations to hold training sessions in film, photo and co-production projects as well as international distribution of short films either they are domestic or abroad.







