Short Synopsis

James is house sitting for an eccentric Entomologist (bug scientist) when one of the potentially dangerous creepy-crawlies escapes from its container. The original version of film was created for a 72 Hour Film Competition.

Medium Synopsis

James takes a job housesitting for Raphael Vargas, an esteemed and eccentric entomologist famed in the insect science community for his incredible bug-communication techniques. The house is filled with tanks containing dangerous and potentially lethal creepy-crawlies. When one of the little guys escapes, James has a lot more to worry about than watching over the house... Handle with Care was originally made for a 72 Hour Flim Festival, meaning the entirety of production took place within a three day time period. We wrote the film on Friday, shot everything (including the time-lapses!) on Saturday, and edited the whole thing on Sunday. This version has seen some final tweaks made to the edit, in order to perfect our original vision!

Long Synopsis

James takes a job house sitting for Raphael Vargas, an esteemed and eccentric entomologist famed in the insect science community for his incredible bug-communication techniques. The house is filled with tanks containing dangerous and potentially lethal creepy-crawlies. When one of the little guys escapes, James has a lot more to worry about than watching over the house... Like protecting his girlfriend from entering the insect warzone, making sure the other bugs don't also escape, not sleeping to ensure his own safety, and of course -- not dying.

This project was originally created for an international 72 Hour Film Competition, meaning the entire project was conceived and shot within two days. Our third day was reserved for editing, but this version has had additional work done to the edit in order to perfect our vision. This film shows the ability of Thursday Shoots to produce quality content even under intense time restrictions and pressure.

The original version of this project made the top 25 films in the competition, and won three different awards. It won two "Best use of Genre" awards for our assigned genres of Mistaken Identity and Surprise Ending; and an award for "Best use of Character" for the assigned bug scientist, Rafael Vargas played by Willy Appelman.

James Best (Lead)



James, playing the inventively named lead roll "James" in Handle with Care, is a talented New York based actor who has starred in many short films. His performance in "Close Shave," got him the Best Supporting Actor award during the 2017 New York 48 Hour Film Project. He played a featured role in "The Purge: Election Year" and starred in award winning short film, "Door to Door." He's also held leading roles on the stage including "The Actor's Nightmare," "With This Ring," "A Rainbow Holiday," and "Last minute Adjustments."

Willy Appelman (Supporting Actor)



Willy Appelman plays Rafael Vargas in "Handle with Care". He is a comedian based in NYC. He hails from the Green Mountains of Vermont and is a graduate of Skidmore College. He recently co-wrote and starred in a webseries for Origin Films and can be seen in the upcoming short, "Under Your Mattress", which he also co-wrote. His short film, "Dear Reni" premiered at The Indianapolis International Film Festival in 2012 and his film "Tall Tale Tanner" won Best Short & Audience Pick at The 2010 Chicago United Film Festival. He has performed at Ars Nova, Chicago Sketchfest, The NY Improv Festival, The Frigid Festival, The Dream Up Festival and recently performed in Adam Szymkowicz's "Clown Bar" (New York Times Critics' Pick).

Willy has studied at NYU's Tisch School of Drama, The Second City, Magnet Theater and UCB with Armando Diaz, Louis Kornfeld, Chris Kelly, Neil Casey, Rich Talarico, Jet Eveleth and Adam Wade to name a few. He is a 2-time Moth StorySLAM winner and has been featured on The Truth Podcast. He recently worked as a Producer for The San Francisco Improv Festival and has worked behind the scenes for HBO, The Colbert Report, TBS, Sesame Street, Comedy Central and The Huffington Post.


Phillip Russell (Producer, DP)



Phillip Russell is primarily a New York based freelance Producer with experience ranging from short web content and commercials to indy feature films. He has created content for TruTV, Above Average, College Humor, UCB Comedy, Funny or Die, and more. He and a growing group of talented filmmakers created a production team named *Thursday Shoots*, who produce videos specializing in comedy. Phil has worked directly with comedic talents such as Brian Quinn (*Impractical Jokers*), Patrick Noth (*The Jim Gaffigan Show*), Nicole Drespel (*Broad City, 30 Rock*) and Shalyah Evans (MTV's *Girl Code*) to name a few.

Phil has received multiple awards both as a Producer and a DP. He and *Thursday Shoots* have won the Audience Choice Award at the New York 48 Hour Film Project 4 years in a row (2014, 2015, and 2016) for their films *Making Friends*, *Night Shift*, and *Door to Door*, and *Close Shave*. The team has received 10 unique awards for 48 Hour and 72 Hour film projects in varying categories, including best VFX, Cinematography, Makeup, Writing, and more. There he received his Bachelor's Degree in Fine Arts and for his senior thesis; wrote, directed and edited the multi-award winning short film Blind Date.

During his time at Five Towns, he also co-founded the production company Thursday Shoots, with two of his other classmates, and continues to make shorts, music videos, sketches, web series, etc. Including his most recent directorial effort Handle with Care which was selected out of almost 200 other projects worldwide to be in the Top 25 films featured for the 4 Points Film Festival in contention for the Audience Choice Award and several other awards including: Best Directing, Best Film, Best Cinematography, etc.



Why are you called Thursday Shoots?

Thursday Shoots was first created in 2011 when a few of us formed a group while attending Five Towns College. We agreed to meet up and film something every Thursday, and decided to name ourselves Thursday Shoots. We still work together professionally to this day, and now get to make movies on more than just Thursdays!

Why do you guys enter film races so much?

We enjoy 48 Hour competitions because they are true challenges. There's nothing more stressful then trying to make a film in an extremely short time period, and nothing more satisfying then handing the completed film in on time. Doing these competitions improved our abilities as filmmakers, and now we can handle high pressure situations better than ever. Need that commercial completed in a couple of days? Cake walk.

Do you only make comedies?

We make comedies a lot, but no we don't exclusively make comedies. We certainly specialize in comedy. We've worked with TruTV, UCB, Collegehumor, Above Average, Funny or Die, and more. That being said, we also love horror, and aren't afraid of jumping into a drama every once and awhile either. We don't discriminate against genres. We'll probably throw a joke or two into the mix, though!

Where did you get all of those bugs last minute?



Handle with Care was the second time I directed a project that had to be completed from start to finish in a 2-3 day window. Film races are intense, but very rewarding when you succeed. A lot of it is a blur, but I remember the final night we were editing down to the last 15 minutes, rushing to make the deadline! Handle with Care was a very fun project to work on from start to finish. My favorite moment during production had to be during the first night when we conceived the idea. Myself and the cinematographer Phillip Russell went on a food run for the crew after the first draft of the script had been completed, and we decided that the movie needed to have a giant caterpillar monster in it -- even with the crazy time restriction!
